# Fire Chief's Message

Greetings! I'm pleased to share with you that this Spring you will have the opportunity to choose to maintain and enhance the emergency services we provide you and your family, as the Board of Fire Commissioners has placed a ballot to restore the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) levy before you in April. The last time this levy was restored was in 2000, almost twenty-five years ago. The levy will maintain services to you by ensuring that every fire station is staffed with a paramedic and that a sufficient number of firefighters arrive within the initial minutes of your emergency to allow for immediate action without having to wait for additional firefighters to arrive.

Paramedics have extensive training in emergency medicine, essentially bringing the services of an intensive care unit to your living room within

minutes. The EMS Levy will help to provide a paramedic at your neighborhood fire station twenty-four hours a day.

In addition to their medical training, your paramedics are cross-trained as firefighters to ensure enough personnel arrive on scene to take immediate action. Because of the complexity of fires and the recent size and intensity of wildland fires we sometimes have a limited ability take initial actions until a firefighting force of at least four firefighters is assembled. The EMS levy helps to ensure there are enough firefighters to go to work right away when lives and property are at risk. And when those paramedic firefighters are engaged in structure or wildland fires, that we have enough funding to call back paramedic firefighters to respond to your medical emergencies.

The current EMS levy is at \$0.29 per \$1,000 of assessed property valuation. The district is asking you to consider restoring the levy to \$.50 per \$1,000 of assessed property valuation.

# **REVIEW OF 2024**

**2024 was a busy year for Fire District 8.** We responded to 4,209 calls for service. Of those, 3,525 were calls for Emergency Medical Services (EMS) followed by 466 calls for Fires or Fire related events, 138 calls for Motor Vehicle Accidents (MVA) and 81 calls for Other or Unclassified.




3,525 EMS CALLS 466 FIRE CALLS 138 MVA CALLS 81 OTHER CALLS



### STEPS YOU CAN TAKE TO IMPROVE YOUR HOME'S WILDFIRE READINESS



Your home and the area from zero to five feet from the furthest attached exterior point of the home is defined as the non-combustible area. Science tells us this is the most important zone to take immediate action on, as it is the most vulnerable to embers.

Start with the house itself then move into the landscaping section of the zone. **Clean roofs and gutters** of dead leaves, debris and pine needles that could catch embers. **Replace or repair any loose or missing shingles** or roof tiles to prevent ember penetration.

Embers are burning pieces of airborne wood and/or vegetation that can be carried more than a mile through the wind. They can cause spot fires and ignite homes, debris and other objects. It is possible for embers to penetrate and smolder in woodpiles, patio/ deck items, vents, roofs and debris filled gutters.

Regardless of wildfire intensity and the distance of embers, research shows home ignitions are determined by the home and its immediate surroundings. It's not where the home is located that necessarily determines risk; it's how ignitable the home is.
